'81 NATIONAL COLLEGIATE UPSET

San Jose State Hoists Cumberland College From 1st Place Standing

COLUMBUS

180 Collegiate contenders assembled at Ohio State University's Larkin Hall in Columbus on Saturday April 4th for the 1981 National Collegiate Judo Championships.

Featuring repechage competition for these Senior men and women, the championships lured some of the Nation's well known contenders from as far away as California, Texas and Florida.

Prevailing over the contest, capturing 6 out of 8 of the men's divisions was San Jose State University of San Jose, California. The team from San Jose, coached by Mr. Yosh Uchida, is rapidly becoming notorious for their collective strength and outstanding players. Needless to

say, San Jose was awarded the 1st place team trophy.

Cumberland College of Kentucky went home in 2nd place, securing the remaining two weight division titles for men.

Miami-Dade Community College, the indomitable junior college from Florida, regained their 3rd place standing for the 2nd year running in men's competition.

In the female category, Cumberland College captured the 1st place team trophy with Slippery Rock State College of Pennsylvania in 2nd place. The women from San Jose State maneuvered into 3rd place for a trophy.

In the mens 132 lb. division, San Jose's Rod Conduragis put away

Ricardo Torres of Miami - Dade to secure the title. In 3rd place was Thomas Worthen of Cumberland.

Gerardo Padilla of San Jose defeated Tom Young of the Colorado School of Mines with a Koka point to take the 143 lb. division. Craig Agena was stable in his 3rd place position here. Agena was the 1980 3rd place winner.

A test of skills and wits ensued in the finals of the 156 lb. class as Mike Swain of San Jose, recently up from the 143 lb. division, met with Eddie Brown of Cumberland. Swain, U.S. Open 3rd placer, was the eventual champ here with Jerry Navarro

of Miami - Dade in 3rd place. Navarro was the 1980 champion of this division as he defeated Tony Mojica of Glendale.

The finals of the 172 lb. class saw excitement as Miami - Dades Roerme Navarro, 1980 champion was successfully put away by Eduardo Cerna of San Jose State with a decision win. Ron Landry was in 3rd place.

Mike Calthamer of San Jose dominated the 189 lb. class and captured the crown defeating Andrew Bernard of Geneva College. Brian Germain regained his 3rd place title from 1980. Germain hails from Cumberland College.

Brad Moss, former wrestler, rose to the top of the +209 lb. category — eliminating Cumberland's Doug Nelson in finals action. Nelson, last year's 3rd place winner, earned 2nd place. David Matsumoto reclaimed his 1980 3rd place title.

With Miguel Tudela not entered in the -209 category, the path was clear for some of his adversaries.

In the Men's Open division, Doug Nelson of Cumberland defended his 1st place title eliminating Robert Strout of Texas.

John Austin of the University of California was left in 3rd place.

WOMEN

In the women's -114 lb. class,

Miki Takemori won a decision over Robin LeCount of Stanford University to gain the crown. Teri Takemori reclaimed her 123 lb. title again this year putting away Kelley De Foor of N. Texas State. Sister Robin Takemori claimed the 3rd place title. Robin was the 1980 1st place champion of the -114 lb. class.

Melanie Ing of Cumberland lost to Cathy Florian in the final match of the -134 lb. class to give her 2nd place for the 2nd year in a row.

Pacific Rim champion and

World Champion contender, Christine Penick, of San Jose State overwhelmed all her opponents to capture the -150 lb. title. Ann Christian of Cumberland was in 2nd place here.

Teresa Von Drasek, up one weight class since last year, moved on to put away reigning champ, Kathy Clark of Cumberland, in the +158 lb. weight division.

Von Drasek was no match for Christine Penick in the Open division; however, as Penick reclaimed this division crown Kathy Clark of Cumberland gained 3rd place.

Special awards for recognition as Best Player went to Mike Swain and Christine Penick, both of San Jose State.
